Prepare To Make Loans Direct From Two Hundred Million Fund. Refinance Plan.

Washington, Aug. 21.-Federal Land bank officious are preparing to make loans direct to farmers out of a \$200,00 fund provided for simplifying and speeding up farm

Presidents of the 12 federal land banks conferring here announced that they would make the recommendation to their board of directors that the institutions handle the loans in this way.

The \$200,000,000 was made available to Albert S. Goss, land bank commissioner, as an emergency special fund to help those farmers in immediate danger of foreclosure.

Heretofore, agents of the land bank commissioner have been in charge of lending the funds from the \$200,000,000; but applications are piling up. Since the land banks handle the applications for refinancing on the land itself it was desided that it would be simpler for them to handle both funds.

Both Henry Morgenthau, jr., gov. ernor of the farm credit adminis eration and Goss, attended the conference and approved the changes

More than 100,000 applications '5 farm refinancing have been receiv ed by the farm credit administration and to handle these the force of appraisers for the land bank system has been raised from 200 on May 12 when the emergency farm mortgage act was passed to 1,200 Nearly an equal number are in training for the work.

The land bank loans, made from an authorization of \$2,000,000,000 by congress, are first mortgage loans made up to one-half the "normal" value of productive farm land, plus 20 percent of the value of insured permanent improvement

The commissioner's loans. stricted to \$5,000, are limited t three-fourths the value of all the farm property and may be used as production of "Dinner at Eight. supplemental loans to reduce and land itself.
