The Results Are Good

With 9-cent cotton under the present "high things to eat and wear" conditions, a farmer of a 1 horse type, with 1 wife and 6 children, earns about 5 cents per day. his wife earns 3 cents per day and each of his kids large enough to work earns about 2 cents per day that's all, too. With this immense income (from their part of the crop, 3 bales—being one-half of the average tenant crop), he has to buy his meat and bread and school books and clothing, etc. A 17-yearold boy in a cotton mill under the new schedule of wages can make more clear money in 5 weeks than a farmer and his flock can make in 12 months, working when the weather is fit. The cotton farmer remains the unforgotten man.




