D. L. Hoyle Dies At Belwood, Age 75; Buried Today
Leaves Four Children, Three Brothers And Three Sisters, Buried Today At Kadesh.

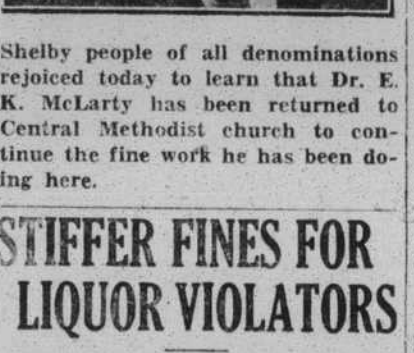
David Lemuel Hoyle, age 75, died Sunday morning at 1 o'clock following a decline in health extending over a period of six or eight months. Mr. Hoyle was one of the county's most esteemed citizens, noted for his honesty and sterling Christian qualities. He was married to Susan Dixon who preceded him to the grave 17 years ago. Funeral services were conducted this morning at 11 o'clock at Kadesh church of which he was a member by Rev. W. L. Scott and a large crowd was present to pay their last tribute to him for his noble and uplifting life. Surviving are four children, Marion Hoyle, Cooleeme, Hugh Hoyle, of Belwood, Addie Hoyle, Cooleeme, Mrs. George E. Gold of Ellenboro, Three brothers, N. A. Hoyle of Blacksburg, Rev. J. W. Hoyle of Durham, Max Hoyle of Hendersonville and three sisters, Mrs. W. F. Campbell of Greensboro, Mrs. W. M. Boggs of Olin and Mrs. Homer Lumbour of Newton also survive. In his passing the county loses one of its most substantial citizens who lived a life which was fraught with high and noble influence upon those with whom he came in contact.

Dry Majority In The State 173,284
Official Canvass of Votes Made In Raleigh Saturday, Total Vote 413,674.

Raleigh, Nov. 20.—The retention of the eighteenth amendment and of prohibition was favored by 293,484 persons who voted against holding any convention to ratify the twenty-first amendment, while 120,190 voted for the convention, which was equivalent to voting for repeal. In the recent election of November 5, according to the official figures announced by the state board of elections when it met here Saturday to canvass the returns. The total vote for dry delegates to the convention, although this convention will never be held, was 300,054 and for wet delegates 115,482, the official tabulation shows, giving a total of 2,862 more votes cast for delegates than were cast on the question of holding the convention. The total vote cast on the convention question was 413,674 and the total vote for delegates 415,536. The total vote cast in the state in the presidential election in November, 1932, was over 711,000.
