That Congress will stand firmly behind President Roosevelt and his policies when it convenes on January 3, is the prediction of Speaker Henry T. Rainey of Illinois and Representative Joseph Byrns of Tennessee, Democratic leaders of the House. But opposition is expected from a section of Progressive Republicans led by Senator Gerald Nye of North Dakota, who threatens his group will run counter to the President unless he espouses real inflation and a big public works program. On the other hand, Senator Hiram Johnson of California, another Republican Progressive, declared the "country must go along with Roosevelt or go to hell economically." The activities of an organization known as the National Association of Manufacturers, ghost of the outfit led by "Uncle" Joe Grundy of Pennsylvania in the Hoover regime, will be interesting during the coming session. All they want is the abandonment of the New Deal.
