

Navy Birds Poised For Mass Flight to Hawaii

The Results Are Good



PLANE COMMANDERS

With the Naval Base at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, as its goal, VP Squadron Ten, of the U. S. Naval Air Force, will leave San Diego, Calif., on January 12, and after a brief halt at San Francisco, will head over the Pacific on the longest non-stop flight ever attempted in mass formation. The six scaplanes to be used in the flight are the same that flew from Norfolk, Va., to Canal Zone last September and later flew from Panama to San Diego. Lt. Commander Knefler McGinnis will command the squadron on the 2,150-mile flight. He is shown at left in group with his five plane commanders, Lieuts. H. J. McRoberts, F. A. Davis, T. D. Guinn, J. Perry and J. L. Averill. The purpose of the flight is to transfer the squadron from San Diego to Hawaii.
