C. W. Hoover, 80, Negro Lawmaker Dies In Raleigh

RALEIGH, Dec. 17.—Charles W. Hoover, 80, one of the last negroes to serve in the North Carolina state legislature, died at his home here Friday after an illness of about a month. Hoover, records show, served in the state house of representatives from Wake county in 1887 as a Republican. About 10 years later he became city alderman. He was born in Randolph county and lived in Raleigh for more than 60 years. Funeral services for Hoover were held Sunday. A widow and daughter survive.
