### Tobacco Report Shows Big Value Gain This Year

WASHINGTON, Dec. 23.-More leaf tobacco and American cigaretes are being sold in the world market, it was disclosed today in a report by the bureau of foreign and domestic commerce, which showed leaf tobacco continued to be the country's third export.

The report, based on the first nine months of 1934, placed the value of leaf tobacco exported through that period at \$71,697,000, or 78.6 per cent greater than last year. This represented 4.7 per cent! of America's exports by value.

The quantity exported amounted to 286,432,000 pounds, or 13.4 per cent greater than a year ago, but eight per cent less than the fiveyear average.

About two-fifths of the country's leaf tobacco crop is normally exported, the report pointing to this as an indication of the importance to American farmers of the export trade in this commodity.

The average price on the export market was 25 cents a pound, an increase of 56 per cent over the 1933 figure.

Cigarette exports totaled 2,449,-000,000 an increase of 43 per cent
