Mayor to Attend Raleigh Meeting Of City Officials

Municipal League Will Honor Entire Legislature At Gigantic Banquet.

Mayor S. A. McMurry expects to attend the meeting of the North Carolina league of Municipalities in Raleigh Jan. 23 at which some 250 city officials will map out a statewide municipal legislative program. They will also honor the members of the general assembly at a huge banquet.

Mayor McMurry is a member of the executive board of the league. The officials meeting will represent the 97 members of the North Carolina League of Municipalities, sponsors of the one-day convention, which will be culminated by a banquet in honor of the legislature.

400 Will Attend.

Few times, if any, in North Carolina's history have members of the general assembly been honored in one group at a banquet. More than 400 legislators, state and city officials are expected to attend the banquet, to be held at the Hotel Sir Walter, scene of the meeting.

Legislative Platform
