896 Are Killed By Automobiles In New Record

RALEIGH, Jan. 27.—Automobiles killed 896 persons in North Carolina in 1934, a new high record for a year, including 117 in December, the State Motor Vehicle bureau reported today.

In 1933 deaths from motor accidents aggregated only 853. There were 6,273 persons injured in wrecks in 1934, as compared with 4,975 hurt in 1933.

Intoxicated drivers caused 11 fatal and 46 non-fatal accidents in December, while speeding motorists caused 28 fatal mishaps and 55 non-fatal. Hit-and-run drivers killed seven and injured 33.

Thirty-nine pedestrians were killed in December and 86 were injured.

Methodist Church Shows Big Gains

Official Year Book Now Out; Per Capita Contributions Increase.

NASHVILLE, Tenn., Jan. 27.—Membership and per capita donations both increased in the Methodist Episcopal church, South, last year, Dr. Curtis B. Haley, official statistician and editor of the General Minutes and Yearbook revealed in his annual report.

The church, at the end of the year, 1934, had on its rolls 2,751,971 lay and clerical members, including baptized infants, the report showed. The total was an increase of 38,280 as compared to 1933.

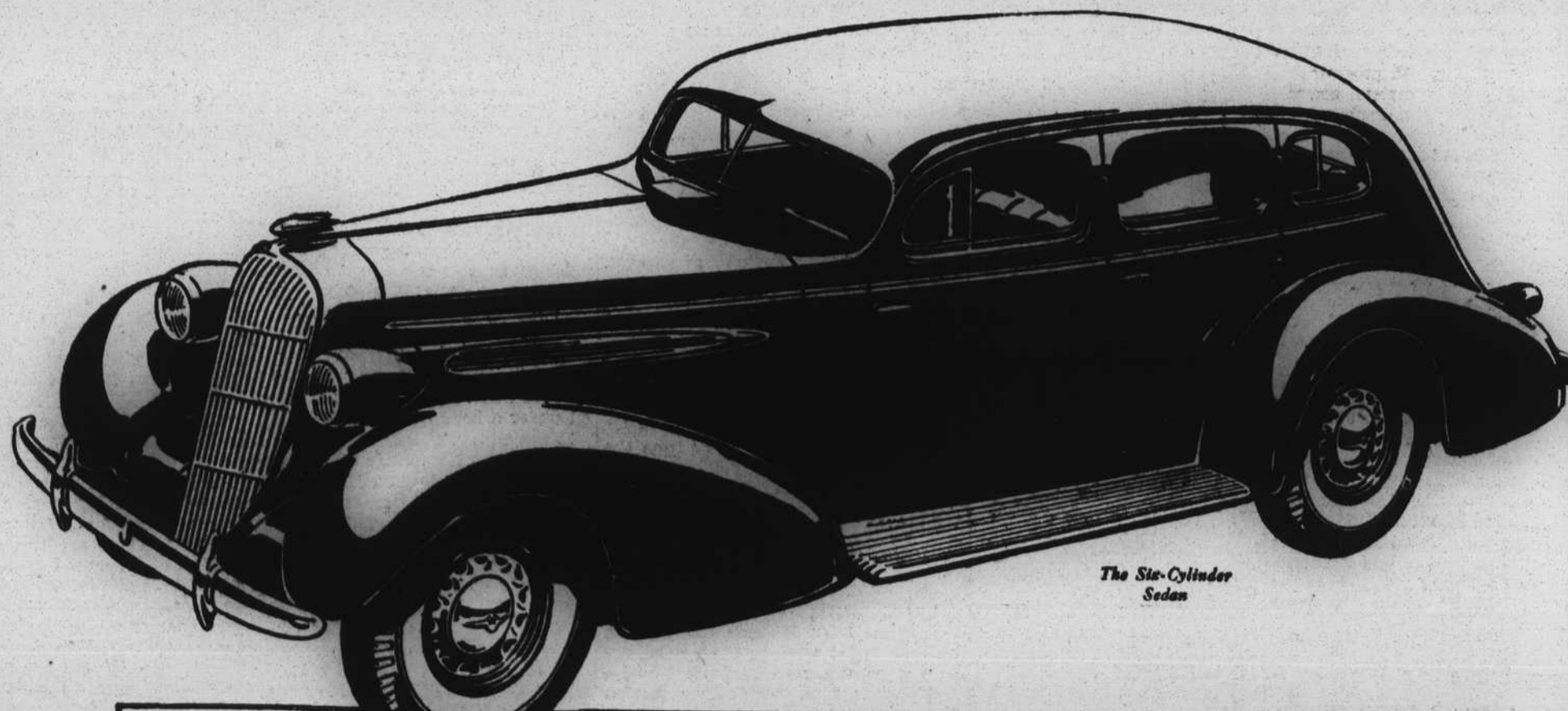
Sixty per cent of the additional membership was gained east of the Mississippi river.

The largest net increase in membership, 8,894, was reported from Bishop W. N. Ainsworth's Episcopal district, including the Holston, South Georgia, North Georgia and Cuba conferences.

The Woman's Missionary society, listing 20,000 members, raised more than \$2,000,000 for home and foreign missions and local work.

For all purposes, the church raised \$23,618,683, approximately \$2,190,000 more than in 1933. Per capita contributions of members increased from \$7.98 in 1933 to \$8.63 in 1934.
