NEW YORK, Dec. 2.-(AP)-Dr. J. H. Breasted, noted archaeologist and head of the oriental institute of the University of Chicago, died early today at the Presbyterian Medical Center. Hospital authorities in announcing the death maintained the same secrecy as to the cause as they had concern-

Dr. Breasted was one of the discoverers of the tomb of King Tutankhamen on whose walls were engraved the words, "Death that toucheth the tomb of a Pharoah."

Dr. Breasted, however, had frequently ridiculed this curse.
