Two Are Killed, Two Hurt In S. C. Auto Collision

SUMTER, S. C., Dec. 16 .- (AP) -Dr. L. V. Brown, 26. Sumter pharmacist, and Miss Ruth Farrelly, 22. Georgetown county home demonstration agent, were killed and Miss Helen Jones, Herbert Jones, and Miss Augustine Sox injured early today in an auto crash near here.

Brown, driving toward Columbia alone, was instantly killed. Miss Farrelly, riding in Jones' car with Miss Jones and Miss Sox, died in a hospital here. Mes Sox suffered serious head injuries. Jones and his sister escaped with minor cuts and bruises. The accident occurred on a sharp turn.

Brown was thrown through the windshield of his car and under the other car. His car caught fire immediately after the crash. The other was also practically demolished.


