The same waterwheel that operated the corn mill also gave power for the first cotton gin. These were in operation 75 years ago.

There was but one gin and it was operated by hand, only one or two bales of cotton could be ginned n one day. The cotton was carried to the gin in hamper baskets and fed by armsful run through to the press that was also run by hand. Farmers wishing to have their turn in line, would have to wait sometimes for two days.




