Couple Escapes Serious Injuries In Accident

A Shallotte couple escaped serious injuries last Thursday morning after their 1974 Ford Pinto station wagon skidded out of control and ended on its side in a ditch on U.S. 17 south of Supply.

Gilbert H. Kitchen, 78, and Jessie D. Kitchen, 74, were both taken to the Brunswick Hospital in Supply with minor injuries by the Shallotte Rescue Squad following the one-car accident.

According to State Trooper W.H. Morgan's report, Kitchen was travel-

ing south on U.S. 17 when his right rear wheel ran off the highway, sending the car into a skid. The car skidded off the right shoulder and landed on its side in a ditch about 5.8 miles north of Shallotte, Morgan reported.

A third passenger in the Kitchen car was not injured. Members of the Supply Volunteer Fire Department also responded and assisted in removing the passengers from the car.

Kitchen was not charged in the 11 a.m. accident. Morgan reported the

driver may have been exceeding a safe speed for the conditions on the wet highway, but was not exceeding the speed limit.

In another accident Friday night, three Leland residents were seriously injured when their 1973 Plymouth struck a tractor trailer truck 2.9 miles northwest of Leland on RPR 1426.

Johnny Lewis Sheppard, 41, Larry Mills, 30, and Virginia Mosley, 26, were all taken to New Hanover Memorial Hospital in Wilmington

with serious injuries.

According to State Trooper J.V. Dove's report, Sheppard's car struck the side of a 1976 White tractor trailer truck driven by Micky Ray Hodges, 34, of Leland.

Dove reported Hodges stated he was backing into a driveway when he saw the Sheppard vehicle approaching. Hodges said he tried to drive his truck out of the way of the Sheppard vehicle.

Sheppard told Dove he did not see the truck until it pulled from the driveway. Dove charged Hodges with failure to yield the right of way.

The accident occurred around 7:45 p.m.

A Leland man was charged with DWI early Saturday morning after his 1973 Chevrolet struck the rear of another vehicle 6.3 miles west of Belville on RPR 1426.

James Roscoe Soles, 43, was charged after his truck ran into the rear of a 1973 Chevrolet truck driven by Royce Samuel Thomas, 45, of Wilmington, State Trooper B.C. Jones reported.

Jones stated Thomas was reducing speed to make a left turn into a private drive when Soles ran into the rear of Thomas' truck.

No one was injured in the 2:30 a.m. accident.

A Wilmington man was arrested last week and charged with the Dec. 31, 1984, larceny of an automobile from a business in Belville, the Brunswick County Sheriff Department reported.

Nicholas J. Cox, 17, is being held in the New Hanover County Jail for auto larceny and on other charges filed by the New Hanover County Sheriff's Department, said Brunswick County Detective Douglas "Sonny" Faggett.

Faggett said Tom M. Rich of Long Beach, owner of Tire City in Belville, reported his 1983 Mazda stolen on Dec. 31. It was recovered in New Hanover County Monday, Jan. 7.

Faggett said the \$8,300 vehicle had been damaged and is now in a garage undergoing repairs.

Library Plans Saturday Hours

The West Brunswick Branch Library will offer Saturday hours again for the first time in a number of years beginning Jan. 19.

Branch Supervisor Nancy Dietrich said her assistant, Lauri Fouquette, will be the staff person working on Saturdays. All regular library services will be available, including interlibrary loans.

Deputies Made 31 Arrests

Brunswick County sheriff's deputies recovered \$20,803 in property while making 31 arrests as prosecuting witnesses during December. Sheriff John Carr Davis reported.

Officers also logged 57,500 miles on 3,975 gallons of gas and 13 quarts of oil. Twelve witnesses were summoned and 381 civil papers were served during the month.

Six juvenile petitions were served while two juvenile petitions were drawn. Deputies also served 229 local and 42 foreign warrants.

Three mental and inebriate papers were served and four doors and windows were found open. Deputies answered 625 calls during the month and made 217 investigations.

Officers served 18 hours in court on duty, eight hours off duty, and 263 hours as duty officer. Three trips out of the county were also recorded and six crime prevention meetings were held.
