Shalotte Board Talks Contract

The Shalotte Town Board of Aldermen met Monday behind closed doors, talking over sanitation proposals with two vendors.

Representatives of Chambers Inc. of South Carolina and Brunswick Refuse discussed contract possibilities with the board, which met last week with representatives of Waste Industries.

The town wants to turn its sanitation service over to a private contractor due to increased demands and high costs of operating its own equipment.

Town Clerk Cynthia Long said she did not know whether or not a decision will be made at the next meeting of the board.

Oceanfront Development To Be Topic At CRC Meeting

The Coastal Resources Commission will consider problems with existing oceanfront development at its meeting Thursday and Friday in Wilmington.

The CRC will discuss ways to reduce losses that could be caused by long-term erosion and storm damage to oceanfront structures. This discussion will take place during the meeting of the implementation and standards committee at 1:30 p.m. Thursday.

The committee will also consider possible revision of rules for oceanfront erosion rate setbacks, and defining navigable waters for pier construction.

At the same time, the planning and special issues committee will review land use plan update recommendations and urban stormwater runoff issues, as well as hurricane preparedness plans and land use planning grants awards for 1986-87.

The meeting will be held at the Wilmington Hilton, 301 No. Water St., with sessions beginning at 9 a.m. They are open to the public.

Alliance To Hear Director

The executive director of the North Carolina Alliance for the Mentally Ill will speak Sept. 22 at the next meeting of the Coastal Tri-County Alliance.

The meeting will be held at 7:30 p.m. in the auditorium of the Area Health Education Center next to New Hanover Memorial Hospital in Wilmington.

Director John Baggett, who has a mentally ill son, assumed the post in June. He and the Alliance were instrumental in swaying the State Legislature to appropriate \$3.75 million in funding of services for the chronically mentally ill at the community level, of which the local Southeastern Mental Health Agency received \$110,000.

Baggett is an ordained minister and is a doctoral student in education.

New Fee Schedule Simpler; Some Will Be Reduced

A revision of the county's building fee schedule should be easier to understand and will also result in smaller fees for some construction projects, according to Brunswick County Planning Director John Harvey.

However, new fees were added for several inspections required by the state that were not previously included on the schedule.

Commissioners approved the revisions at their Monday night meeting. Harvey said the changes came about after Commissioner Benny Ludlum pointed out that there was a misconception that the method used to determine values for projects would make its way into the tax revaluation.

The revised schedule is based on simpler formulas.

With the new schedule, for example, there would be no charge for building construction of heated or air conditioned spaces 300 square feet in size or less. Currently the charge is \$35.

Also, a slight reduction results for asphalt drives and parking lots, now in a separate category. Concrete work remains in the uncovered space

category, for which the charge is slightly higher.

New items include a \$20 charge for inspecting the new foundation for a house that has been moved; a no-charge permit for tents used no more than 30 days; and a charge of 25 cents per linear foot for inspecting retaining walls, seawalls and bulkheads. Under plumbing, the county will now charge a \$3 per space fee for inspecting travel trailer and recreational vehicle spaces, with a \$10 minimum.

Also, the county will now use the ASCS office's determination of whether a structure qualifies as a farm building. Harvey said this move would open up the category to smaller acreages not considered farms by the tax office.

Harvey said the local home builders association had endorsed the revisions.

In other business, commissioners recessed their meeting until 1 p.m. on Oct. 6, at which time they will begin interviewing applicants for a programmer analyst position. On Oct. 7, beginning at 10 a.m., they will interview applicants for a new soil scientist position.
