

ed bill would increase the fine for littering from \$50 for the first offense to \$200, and an increase from \$200 to \$500 for a second offense.

Redwine said he plans to introduce a local bill that would authorize wildlife enforcement officers to enforce the littering laws in Brunswick County. "I believe this will help deter some people from littering on the waterways," he suggested.

Also, last week Redwine, chairman of the ABC Committee, introduced HB 214. This act would conform the hours of alcohol sales in the state to federal Daylight Savings Time. Congress has recently changed the beginning of Daylight Savings Time from the last Sunday in April to the first Sunday in April. This bill would conform state law to public law and will keep holders of alcohol permits from being in violation of the law.

Redwine also co-sponsored HB 195, which would appropriate \$2 million in 1987-88 and 1988-89 fiscal yers for the N.C. Rural Economic Development Center for its operation and for pilot programs and research.

This center, he said, will be established to address agribusiness, the decline of manufacturing employment, the opportunities for natural resource-based industries and the loss of businesses in small cities and rural areas.
