### Friday Is Crop Report Deadline

May 15 is the deadline for filing reports on small grain crops, according to Alfred Willetts of the Brunswick County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service in Bolivia.

The final date for reporting on spr-

ing seeded crops, such as corn, tobacco and peanuts, is June 15. Summer seeded crops, including grain sorghum and soybeans, must be reported by August 1.

Farm combinations must have been requested prior to the normal

planting dates for the crop, so combinations will no longer be accepted for farms with tobacco, except in unusual circumstances.
