## Access Road At Park Is Completed

Brunswick County Resources Development Commission Executive Director Michael deSherbinin told commission members Monday that work was completed last week on the access road into Leland Industrial Park, ending a project that began last fall.

At Monday night's regular meeting, deSherbinin showed board members 25 photographs of the road construction process, which he said began in September 1986.

DeSherbinin said completion of the road project was delayed approximately four months due to 120 days of rainfall that had held up construction work since last September.

However, three weeks of dry weather in October allowed the project to be completed last week, he said.

The use of coal ash in stabilizing

the 6,000 linear foot road was of particular interest.

After rough work was done by a local contractor, the Brunswick County Economic Development Corporation (BEDC) hired KBK Enterprises to blend six inches to eight inches of bottom ash from Carolina Power and Light Co.'s Sutton Plant into the road's sub-base, he said.

Four inches of a coarse material were added to the road surface by the local contractor, L.M. McLamb Construction, and were compacted by KBK, he said.

In other business, deSherbinin said the RDC's 1986-87 annual audit showed that "everything is in order."

The audit, which was done by the local accounting firm of Brock, Berry and Padgett for the year ending June 30, showed that there were "no problems, everything was ac-

counted for, and there were no deficiencies whatsoever," said deSherbinin.

The RDC Monday also reviewed proposals from three local engineering firms to examine alternatives for development of a gravity sewer collection system for Leland Industrial Park, deSherbinin said.

Action was deferred until the matter can be reviewed by the BEDC, which is considering construction of 2,000 linear feet of gravity sewer lines to further enhance BEDC property in the park, he said.

Funds for the sewer system would not be requested from Brunswick County, but would be derived from sales of land in the industrial park, deSherbinin said.

During his director's report, deSherbinin brought the RDC up to date on several projects underway.

He said representatives of a New Jersey firm will visit Brunswick County and one other county in the state on Thursday (Nov. 12), to look for an industrial site.

Brunswick County is at a disadvantage, he said, because the company needs a 15,000 square foot building immediately, and the county has nothing available now, except a "shell" of a building.

In another project, deSherbinin said Landmark Organization Inc., has proposed to construct a building to lease to an unnamed tenant.

Also, a representative from the state Community Development Block Grant program is expected Thursday (Nov. 12) to review local grant filing procedures, deSherbinin said.

The visit is simply for technical assistance, he said.

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
