It's Girl Scout Cookie Time

What do Samoas, Tagalongs, Thin Mints, Do-si-dos, Trefoils and Echoes have in common?

They're all Girl Scout cookies, and local troops are taking orders through February 8 for delivery in mid-March.

Eva Crumpler of Supply, cookie manager/assistant leader of Brownie Troop No. 724 and new Junior Troop 859 in Shallotte, said the annual cookie sale is the main fundraising project for local troops. For example, last year Troop No. 724 earned more than \$500.

Local troops retain 30 cents per box from the cookie sales, while the council and bakery also get shares of the profits. Council proceeds are used for operations, camping and other special programs.

This year's price is unchanged from last year, \$2 per box, with the count per box ranging from 15 to 41 cookies per box depending on the type cookie chosen.

New this year in the Girl Scout

cookie line is Echo, a chocolate sandwich with vanilla cream filling which Mrs. Crumpler describes as "not quite as sweet as an Oreo."

Returning in the line-up are Samoas, a vanilla, caramel, toasted coconut and chocolatey cookie; Do-si-dos, a crunchy oatmeal peanut butter cream; Thin Mints, a wafer with cocoa coating and natural peppermint flavoring; Tagalongs, chocolatey coated peanut butter patties; and the Trefoil, a classic shortbread.

"Trefoils are an old favorite, but Samoas are awfully popular," said Mrs. Crumpler. "We had to reorder them three times last year."

In addition to contacting any local Girl Scout, Shallotte area residents can order cookies by calling Mrs. Crumpler at 842-9356.

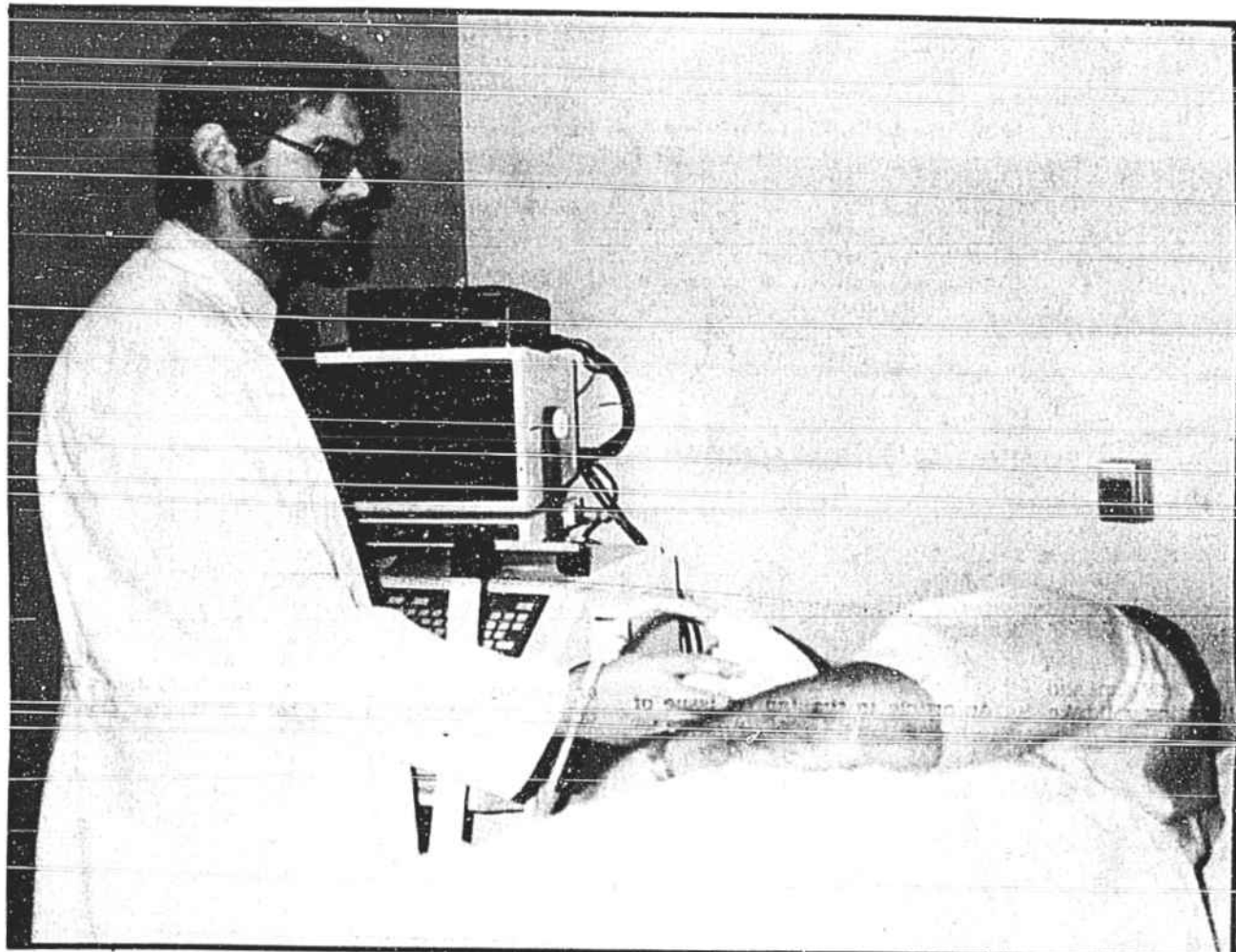
