It's normally signed at the wed ding, not the reception. How to make sure everyone signs? Position it at the end of the receiving line, at the table where reception guests get their seat assignments, or have an attendant assigned to pass it around from table to table during dimer. table during dinner.

While not strictly in holding with traditional etiquette, RSVP cards make life easier for both you and those you in-vite. You must include return postage if you use RSVP cards. A suggestion: use an index card file to catalogue the cards as they are returned; you can make notes on them as to gifts received and shuffle them to decide seating
