themselves, know someone who has. A program of love songs seemed a fitting subject for the concert, she said, since love is often what gets women into situations where domestic violence occurs in the first

"I thought anyone who has been battered could appreciate that," Ms. Reid continued. "I thought we could have some fun with it and get some help for it.

"The time comes when you have to stop crying, lick your wounds and start to live again-at least if there is a place to go to like Hope Harbor Home. Other women stay where they are-sometimes until they're killed, she added.

"An Evening of Love Songs" will run the gamut of musical styles and

"I will try to touch as many types of people as there might be in the audience," explained Ms. Reid. "There will be several tunes for country lovers, something for blues lovers, something for the appreciatiors of

"I might even share a reggae number," she added. Depending upon who accompanies her, that song could be her own "Mysterious You," soon to be released as a single on the

Right now, she expects three men whose names should now be familiar locally to return for the event-Jesse Hamilton of Charlotte and Visiting Artists Michael Porter of Durham Technical College and Allen Youngblood of Richmond Technical College.

The Visiting Artist Program is a

joint project of the N.C. Arts Council and N.C. Department of Community Colleges. It encourages appreciation for and cultivation of the arts in small communities and rural areas throughout the state, while allowing the participants time for their own artistic development.

Ms. Reid was seen most recently in the role of Connie in L.J. Carlino's 'Snow Angel" at the Afro-American Cultural Center in Charlotte. Last summer she taught jazz and reggae dance for six weeks at Pembroke State University as part of a summer

enrichment program for youths. This summer, she'll be leaving-for her "other home" of New York, then Toronto and Las Angeles-then whatever.

After two years in rural Brunswick County, she's ready for a taste of city life, she said, though she's not exactly sure what she'll be doing or where next fall. "But I am sure it is going to be exciting and challenging," added Ms. Reid, "because I will make sure it is in a more cosmopolitan
