Pre-School Registration Begins Monday

Pre-school registration begins at all county primary and elementary schools Monday and continues through Friday, May 27. According to Superintendent John

A. Kaufhold, the registration is for children who will be entering kindergarten or first grade this fall for the first time. Hours are 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

To enroll in kindergarten, a student must be at least five years old on or before Oct. 16. The adult accompanying the child should have a certified copy of the child's birth certificate, an immunization or shot record signed by the family doctor or health department, and a social security number. By Jan. 1, 1989, a health form must also be completed and filed with the school

Under North Carolina state law, immunizations are required as

 Diptheria, tetanus and whooping cough-four doses, including three by age 1 and a booster on or after the fourth birthday:

•Oral Poliomyelitis (polio) vaccine-three doses of trivalent type on or after the fourth birthday or one dose of each of the three monovaint types by age 2 and a dose of trivalent type after the fourth birthday;

 Mumps vaccine—one dose of live attenuated vaccine by age 2.

Parents are asked to register their child at the school in the district where they live. Also, a parent must complete a registration form and part of a kindergarten health assessment at the school

To be legally enrolled in school, said Superintendent Kaufhold, a child must be properly immunized by Oct. 1 and the health form completed by Jan. 1, 1989.

He suggested that questions regarding dates or procedures be directed to the principal of the school a child will attend.

Required vaccinations are available through the Brunswick County Health Department in Bolivia or from private physicians.
