with one count of breaking, entering and larceny.



Property valued at \$504 was taken from the four homes. The stolen goods included food, alcoholic beverages, small household items and about \$50 in cash.

Ocean Isle Beach Police drew arrest warrants for the three suspects last Thursday. Sgt. James Stewart took all three into custody the same

All three made first appearances in Brunswick County District Criminal Court on Friday. Probable cause hearings were scheduled to be held Wednesday (June 1).


