

Tar Heel People, Places Focus Of 'The Big Click'

Amateur and professional photographers have an opportunity to be published while helping to promote their community during "The Big Click," a statewide photography event, Friday, April 21.

Photographers are encouraged to capture their community on film on this one specific day. Chosen photographs will be compiled into a full-color book which will serve to promote the state by showcasing its vitality and diversity, said Philip Morgan, a local professional photographer involved in the effort. "The Big Click: Photographs of One Day in North Carolina" will be a photographic journal that captures the essence of the Tar Heel day and its people.

Uc'Bee's Some 'Bird' To See

Whiteville area residents are already clucking about United Carolina Bank's newest employee, and people in neighboring counties may soon be.

Uc'Bee (pronounced Uk-bee) popped up March 20 in UCB's main office in Whiteville, "hatched" from a huge six-foot egg that had been incubating in the lobby.

About six feet tall, the bird-like fellow's covered mostly by blue and white feathers except for a gray pinstripe vest which covers an ample tummy. A shiny watchchain with fob hangs across his plump midsection and a satin black bowtie accents his tuxedo-style shirt and bright yellow beak.

Uc'Bee, says UCB spokesman Janice Young, is particularly interested in children and their needs, such as financial education, public awareness and safety, and will be

visiting schools to present programs.

He will also participate in public awareness programs that relate to good health habits and safety, such as fire prevention, saying no to drugs and safe biking.

For now, Uc'Bee is making the rounds of Columbus and nearby Duplin and Bladen counties, but may soon branch out.

Uc'Bee's already been invited to the Azalea Parade in Wilmington, she noted, adding, "I wouldn't be surprised a bit if he—or one of his brothers or sisters—doesn't show up at the Fourth of July Parade in Southport." Uc'Bee, it seems, may soon be joined by as many as a half-dozen brothers and sisters.

County Inspectors Issue 357 Permits In February

The Brunswick County Building Inspection Division issued 357 permits in February, including 137 building, 138 electrical, 35 plumbing and 47 mechanical permits.

Permits were issued for 19 single-family units valued at \$1,263,678; two multi-family buildings, \$239,515; 11 commercial buildings, \$1,849,018; three remodeling projects, \$48,168; 16 additions, \$233,068; eight garages, \$107,960; six decks, \$19,400; two

pools, \$12,960; and two signs, \$6,960. Total value of construction permitted in February was \$3,760,087. Some \$6,032,660 worth of construction in 1989 and \$19,096,857 worth of construction in the 1988-89 fiscal year have been authorized.

The division collected \$15,698.50 in permit fees in February. Also, it has collected \$28,556.50 in 1989 and \$109,309.85 during the current fiscal year.
