The one-mile fun run begins the races at 7:30 a.m., followed by the 5-kilometer (3.1 miles) and 10-kilometer (6.2 miles) events that start together after the conclusion of the one-mile race.

Men's and women's first-place finishers in the one-mile run will receive trophies, as will the age division winners in both the 5-K and 10-K events.


Second and third-place finishers, male and female, in each of the five age groups in the 5-K and 10-K races will receive ribbons.

The race course is a flat, out-andback design, along Ocean Blvd. West with aid stations and split times available at the one and threemile points.

In addition, there will also be post-race refreshments available and an awards ceremony at the event's conclusion.
