Marsh Harbour Marina Grand Opening Slated

Marsh Harbour Marina, a new vacation resort in Calabash, will celebrate with a grand opening Saturday, according to a news release.

The site, with nearly 44 acres, is on the border of North and South Carolina, adjacent to Marsh Harbour Golf Links and the new Ocean Harbour golf course.

A major international hotel chain will operate a 150-room, all-suite hotel on a terraced site surrounding the marina, the news release continues.

The hotel will include convention facilities, indoor/outdoor pool, restaurant and lounge with patio dining, exercise room, game room and several specialty shops.

Marsh Harbour Yacht Club, part of the complex, will consist of 88 two-bedroom completely furnished townhouses in 11 detached buildings.

The first building, with model units, is sold out but the second one

is under construction and will be complete this July, developers said.

Construction is slated to start by the end of this year on 70 "very exclusive" waterfront villas directly overlooking the marina.

Marsh Harbour Marina is located along the Intracoastal Waterway at Little River Inlet (Marker 343), where 10,000 boaters pass annually, say developers.

The marina is currently home port for 80 boats. Upon completion, 265 slips will be available.

A restaurant and commercial offices are located at the entrance to Marsh Harbour Marina. Additional commercial development will be constructed in the near future.

Helomer Development Corporation, the marketing entity for Marsh Harbour Yacht Club, as well as Associated Builders Corporation, the contracting entity for the project, maintains home office at this location.

Expo Offers Bird's Eye View

Helicopter rides offering a bird's eye view of the coast will be offered next weekend at the South Brunswick Islands Chamber of Commerce Small Business Expo.

The expo is slated for Saturday, May 12, from 10 a.m. until 6 p.m. at the Sea Trail Plantation buildings near the intersection of N.C. 179 and N.C. 904 at Seaside. Admission is free.
