## Former Cougar Leads Region X JUCO Baseball

Former South Brunswick baseball standout Scott Gales is the Region X Independent Junior College Conference's leading hitter with the Southeastern Community College Rams in Whiteville.

Gales, a freshman, is hitting at a hot .390 clip with 23 hits in 59 plate appearances in games played through April 15.

This is nothing new for the former Cougar as he has been the league's

leading hitter for the past three weeks. Gales went 2-for-2 last week in an 8-1 loss to Louisburg Junior College

in the second game of a doubleheader.

SCC freshman Dino Daniels, a former West Brunswick star and county baseball player of the year last spring, saw two innings of relief pitching in the first game against Louisburg, a 9-2 Ram loss.

Gales also saw three-plus innings of pitching duty for the Rams in the first game of a doubleheader against Spartanburg Methodist last weekend. SCC suffered twin losses, 13-2, in the opener and 13-1 in the second con-

Gales, who was credited with the loss, was one of three Rams pitchers to see action in the opener. SCC hurlers walked 14 batters in the game while giving up only six hits.

In a doubleheader loss to Chowan Junior College earlier last week, Daniels was the losing pitcher going six-plus innings in a 9-4 defeat in the

Daniels yielded only two runs till the seven inning when Chowan exploded for seven runs in the final two frames.

Gales went 2-for-4 in the game including a solo home run in the third inning.
