Schools Face Off Dec. 8 For '91 Quiz Bowl Honors

"Who is the highest paid athlete in the U.S. by the hour?

This could be one of the questions asked Dec. 8, when West Brunswick High School defends its county championship in the 1991 Brunswick County Quiz Bowl.

Teams from each county high school face off in the event, which will be held for the first time at Brunswick Community College at Supply. Starting time is 1 p.m. Admission is free and open to the public

The quiz bowl, now in its 12th year locally, is a general knowledge competition for high school students sponsored by the Brunswick County Public Library in cooperation with the Brunswick County Schools and the North Carolina State Library.

Competing teams are selected through a process of elimination that includes a pre-test and in-school competition. Each school selects a team and two alternates.

In the double-elimination competition team members take turns answering questions posed by the moderator. The questions, which cover current events as well as a broad range of subject material, come from a volume of questions compiled by a state committee representing participating libraries
