### Workshop Offers Advice On Getting Student Aid

Parents of Brunswick County high school students can find out about financial aid for college study at a free workshop scheduled Tuesday, Jan. 15, from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. in the ALS building teaching auditorium at Brunswick Community College near Supply.

Conducted by Linda Morefield, BCC's financial aid officer, the workshop will cover several facets of financial aid, said Bertha Bell, a guidance counselor at West Brunswick High School. These will include advice on how to complete a standard college aid application used by two- and four-year institutions and mistakes commonly made in filling them out; and the different types of grants, loans and work-study programs available for students.

Information on local scholarships is available from counselors at each of the three county high schools, since they vary from school to school.

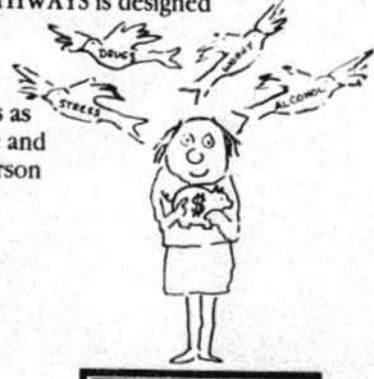
