## Weekend Show Spotlights Quilting As An Art Form WAGNER, KIND TO APPEAR

A quilt is a bed covering or other item made by sandwiching two layers of fabric with a layer of batting between and stitching them firmly together, usually in a decorative pat-

But that defination only hints at the creativity of local quilters.

Quilts may be simple or ornate, practical or fanciful. Some are family heirlooms, group projects, wearable works of art.

Most any type of quilt one could imagine will go on display Saturday and Sunday at Quilt Show '91. Sponsored by the Brunswick County Extension Homemakers, the biennial show at Shallotte Middle School will feature more than 100 entries-some for display only, others for evaluation by judges.

Admission is \$1 per day. Hours are 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. on April 6 and 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. April 7.

In past years the show has proven to be very popular, with some people returning a second day to look once again at their favorite entries, said Mary L. Russ, home economics extension agent.

"It brings back memories," she said. "People enjoy the show so much

Visitors to the show will award one ribbon of their own by popular vote, with all entries eligible, said

Isobel Beebe, publicity chairman. The winner of the Choice" ribbon will be announced about 4:45 p.m. Sunday, just before the show closes.

At the same time the winner of a quilt made and donated to the extension homemakers for a fund-raising project will also be announced. Tickets will be available until just before the drawing.

Also planned are a merchants' mall featuring craft supplies as well as craft items offered for sale by some extension homemakers, a display of items made by club members for the Ronald McDonald House at Durham.

Quilting and other craft-related demonstrations are planned Saturday and Sunday.

At 11:30 a.m. Saturday, Eleanor Hoff and other members of the quilt show committee will demonstrate how to set a quilt in the frame for quilting. The quilt will remain on display throughout the balance of the show, and visitors will be encouraged to add stitches of their own. "We'll show them how," said Mrs. Russ.

Dee Wells will demonstrate crazy quilting using velvets and embroidery stitches. Eleanor Hoff will demonstrate template applique, a 'quickie" technique for applique using plastic templates. Mrs. Russ will demonstrate a technique called quick piecing for making triangle blocks quickly. Morie Austin will demonstrate "New Paths," a new way to do the Drunkard's Path pattern. Hilda Lewis will show how to use tape and hand stitching to make Battenburg lace.

Visitors are asked to don disposable plastic gloves, which are provided, to avoid soiling the entries.
