## Presbyterians To Dedicate Facility Sunday

Shallotte Presbyterian Church Solomon's United Church of Christ, will dedicate its new church facility Sunday, April 7, at 11 a.m.

#### **Buddhists** Celebrate

The Buddhist Songkran Festival will be celebrated Saturday, April 13, by the Buddhist Association of North Carolina at the site of monastery on Midway Road in Bolivia.

The ancient festival allows Buddhists an opportunity to make religious merit at the beginning of lunar New Year. It is a time when children perform religious ceremonies in remembrance of deceased ancestors as well as their living elders.

This year's festival will support the continuing construction of the temple's multipurpose building. Local Buddhists and others are invited to participate, offering gifts for the building effort and making merit on behalf of their elders and ancestors.

The program begins at 10:15 a.m. and continues into mid-afternoon. It includes a candle-lighting ceremony, presentation of foods to the monks, dinner, a ceremonial parade and presentation of gifts, chanting by the monks and meditation by guests and a sermon by the monks, "Veneration of Our Elders."

The monks will offer merit and blessing for the deceased and blessing for the guests, followed by the pouring of lustral waters by the congregation as a symbol of merit making on behalf of their deceased ancestors. Afterward guests will receive the blessing of the monks thorugh the sprinkling of holy water.
