Blue Crab Festival Plans Children's Area

Children are a lot less likely to get "crabby" at this year's Blue Crab Festival, May 18 and 19 at Little River, S.C., because the festival is offering a special area just for kids.

"We're trying to focus more on the family," said Elizabeth Teal, executive for the Little River Chamber of Commerce, which sponsors the festival. "In particular there have been very few things for children to do at the festival."

But no more. This year the festival is expanding to include a special children's section, in an area just to the left after entering the festival gate.

A moon station, train rides, face

painting, clowns and a roving magician, balloon sculpturing and a Boy Scout camping demonstration are intended "to keep children happy and occupied so Mom and Dad can go shop," she said.

Teal said parents should feel comfortable leaving older children in the roped-off area unaccompanied, while younger children should have an adult with them.

Festival-goers can count on continuous entertainment, plenty of arts and crafts for show and sale, and seafood and other taste treats.

Ms. Teal said 100 exhibitors have been accepted for the arts and crafts show, offering everything from pottery, watercolor paintings and wood carvings to handmade children's toys and handsmocked children's wear.

Fifteen food booths will sell treats that include crab cakes, shrimp, crawfish, hotdogs, pizza, homemade ice creams and other desserts.


