Odell Williamson donated \$250,000, which was used to build the church. Mrs. Williamson said the \$9,000 contributed by landowners was used to purchase pews, chairs, a communion table and other

The church will not be taking memberships. "They're welcome to come any time they want to," Mrs. Williamson said. "The people who are visiting here won't have to go out and hunt a church." Mrs. Williamson said she's not
