

South Valedictorian Urges Grads To Follow Lead Of U.S. Soldiers

Valedictorian Amelia Hawes urged her South Brunswick High School classmates to follow the example set by Americans who fought in Operation Desert Storm at graduation ceremonies last Friday.

"We too must be brave and strong as we step out into the real world," Miss Hawes told the class of 1991, reminding students they can become whatever they want as long as they believe in themselves.

South Brunswick Principal Mose Lewis presented diplomas to approximately 193 seniors during the festive commencement at Cougar Stadium Friday night.

Brunswick County Schools Superintendent P.R. Hankins told graduates they are the future of our nation. "You have an awesome task ahead of you, trying to make the world a better place."

Graduates shouldn't be afraid of their task, Hankins said, because their education has prepared them to become productive and capable citizens.

Brunswick County Board of Education Chairman Donna Baxter, whose daughter was among the South Brunswick graduates, stressed good citizenship and commitment to others.

Being a good citizen means exercising the right to vote, participating in local meetings, contacting elected officials and respecting the laws of society.

Ms. Baxter said graduates should always care about others, become givers instead of takers and get involved as volunteers.

"I offer no quotes from famous people or no profound statement," she said. "Always be proud of who you are and where your roots are, because we sure are proud of you."

Salutarian Kristin Jones called graduation "a sunrise and a sunset" and a day that signifies a fork in the road.

"On this day the past, present and future mingle together," she said. "We are about to leave the nest and test our own wings."

As part of the ceremony, seniors Andrena Evans and Lovely Manlove sang *One Moment In Time* as a tribute to the class of '91.

Class president Ernest Wearren Jr. presented the class gift to the school, a \$75 donation that will be used to purchase a plant for the lobby.

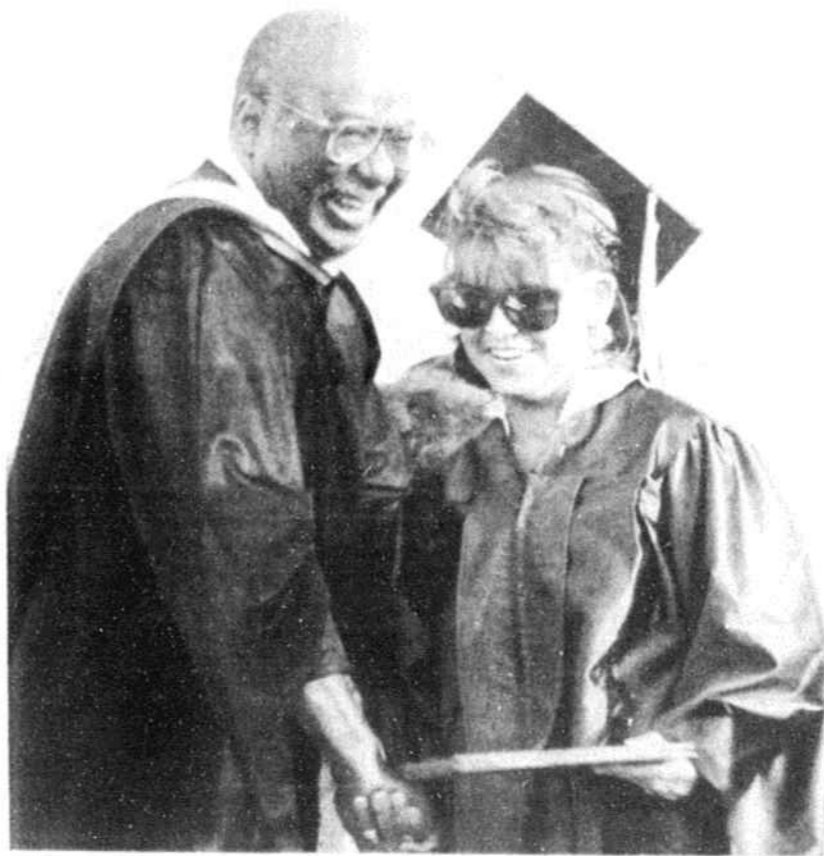
