Varnamtown Holds Hearing On Budget

The tax rate in Varnamtown would stay at 4 1/2 cents per \$100 under the proposed 1991-92 budget that comes up for a public hearing next Monday at 7:30 p.m. in town hall.

The \$72,071 budget includes \$11,406 for payments on the town hall, \$7,600 for street lights, \$3,117 for building and ground improvements and \$2,500 for street signs.

Anticipated revenues include \$36,000 in sales tax, \$26,846 in fund balance and \$3,700 in franchise tax.

Town officials expect to collect \$3,645 in town taxes next fiscal year. The owner of a \$45,000 home would pay about \$20 in taxes.






