Francis Womack, minister; members of the session; Darius Lewellyn, contractor with Lewellyn-Lewis; and others.

The church has been meeting for two years in the VFW Hall at Traders Village in Calabash.

Then, in February 1990, a commission of Coastal Carolina Presbytery organized the new congregation. Rev. McCann served as its interim minister until the appointment of Womack in November 1990 as the first full-time pastor.

The building to be erected will include a multipurpose room that will be used for both worship and fellowship events. The facility will also include two offices, rest rooms, a kitchen and a classroom.
