Adult Day Care Center Needs Recliners, Office Furniture

month, the new Brunswick Adult Day Care inc. center in Shallotte still needs furnishings, including at least six recliners.

State law requires that the nonprofit center have available a recliner or a bed for each client, said volunteer Katherine Shawver, who is also chairman of the South Brunswick Interchurch Council, which helped organize the non-prof-

Beds are not practical at the center because of space, so the center is instead using recliners. It has received two so far, but expects to open with a daily client load of

eight people.

The center, located at 106 Al Street, will be the second Brunswick Adult Day Care Inc. site in Brunswick County. The first opened in Southport last year.

Vet Advocates To Hear Abrams

Ronald "Ron" Abrams, director of Legal Publications and Training for the National Veterans Legal Services Project, will conduct a workshop for veterans advocates Sept. 5 at Wrightsville Beach.

The workshop, which is open to area attorneys and veteran advocates, is part of the fall conference of the North Carolina Association of County Veteran Service Officers

According to Julia Hayes, assistant veteran services officer for Brunswick County, Hayes is well known in Veterans Administration and legal circles in Washington, D.C. She described Abrams as a "heavy hitter".

In his present role Abrams trains private bar and public interest attorneys, service representatives from national veteran service organizations, state veteran service officers, homeless advocates and congressional case workes.

Previously Abrams served with the Veterans Administration from 1976 through 1988 as a rating board member, as a legal consultant in the Compensation and Services, where he was responsible for quality control, and as counsel to the Automated Data Processing Service.

Local veteran advocates and attorneys may call Ms. Hayes at 253-4307 for information on registering for the Abrams workshop.

The centers offer quality daycare to those age 60 and older at a cost of \$20 per day, less than the actual \$28 a day cost of providing service,

said Mrs. Shawver. Clients can register to come on a daily basis, freeing a family member for other responsibilities, or on an occasional basis, to provide their regular care providers a respite or an opportunity to run errands. The center offers families an alternative to nursing home placement for an elderly relative, or perhaps delays nursing home placement.

Other needs for the new Shallotte site, said Mrs. Shawver, include a rolling desk chair, two office chairs, a filing cabinet, end tables, lamps, pictures, a microwave oven and a 12-cup coffeemaker.

The center also would like a screen to place in front of the closed fireplace, which cannot be used under state regulations. And Mrs. Shawver said decorative items to make the setting more homelike would also be welcomed.

Center volunteers are also accepting donation of items in good condition for a yard sale planned later in the year.
