# Plenty of 'Firsts' In Third Week Of Prep Grid Season

The third week of the local high school football season was highlighted by a number of "firsts.

At West Brunswick, the Trojans recorded their first-ever football win over Mullins, S.C., 6-0.

While the two teams had met only twice before last Friday, Mullins had won both times including a 58-6 rout in 1977, the last time the two squared off in Shallotte.

The triumph over the Auctioneers was also West Brunswick's first win following an open date since 1988. The Trojans were idle two weeks ago and head coach Marshall Seay indicated his teams have had a tendency to be a little down following a week off.

The win also left West Brunswick (3-0) as the only unbeaten team in the Waccamaw 2-A Conference.

The Trojans have outscored their first three opponents of the current campaign 76-7, their best scoring margin since 1987 in Seay's second year. That season the Trojans outscored its opening three fees 124-32

Still, Seay sees plenty of improvement for his offense following last Friday's game against Mullins.

'Friday was one of those nights where you better be pretty glad to get a win. This is just what we need," Seay said in reference to the close game.

"I think our kids will focus in a lot better from here on out. They almost tasted defeat against Mullins. Our defense rose to the occasion but our offense never did.

"The most disappointing thing about it was that we spent about 80 percent of our practice time last week on offense. I'm just pleased to get a win and proud of our kids," added Seay.

Wallace-Rose Hill got its first-ever win over a Bill Hewett-coached team in the Bulldogs' 26-7 romp over South Brunswick last Friday.

Hewett, who compiled an impressive 67-11 record at Whiteville before coming to South Brunswick, had guided his Wolfpack teams over Wallace-Rose Hill in a number memorable state 2-A playoff wins during his sixyear tenure

Hewett's 1984 team defeated Wallace-Rose Hill 28-7 in the eastern finals and his 1986 state-championship squad nipped the Bulldogs in the second round of post-season play.

Hewett got his final win over Wallace-Rose Hill, 27-6, in the opening round of the 1987 state playoffs.

Speaking of Wallace-Rose Hill, former Bulldog coaching great Thell Overman has been one of four selections to the North Carolina High School Athletic Association Hall of Fame.

Overman put together tremendous coaching records in football, basketball and baseball while at Warrenton and later at Wallace-Rose Hill.

Overman compiled a 278-73-6 football coaching record, a 541-118 baseball mark and a 259-42 basketball record.

Overman, along with Bud Phillips of Greenville, the late Raymond Rhodes of Raleigh and the late Frank Mock of Kinston will all be inducted into the Hall of Fame at ceremonies during halftime of the South Carolina vs. North Carolina football game in Chapel Hill on Nov. 16.

Previously-unbeaten East Bladen also lost for the first time last Friday to defending state 2-A champion Clinton 21-13.

The Dark Horses (2-1) will open league play Friday hosting South Brunswick. The Cougars might find themselves in for a long night as veteran East Bladen coach Lennon Fisher will have his team out to avenge the loss.

### Tough After A Loss

West Brunswick will be attempting a difficult task Friday when the Trojans visit the Wolfpack in the first week of Waccamaw 2-A Conference grid play.

A Trojan win would be the second consecutive loss for Whiteville which dropped an 18-14 decision to Tabor City last Friday.

The Wolfpack hasn't lost back-to-back regular season games since 1983. That season the Whiteville, under then head coach Frank Ciamillo, fell to West Columbus (14-7) and Hallsboro (20-6) on consecutive weeks.

Whiteville went on to finish 6-3-1 that season which was also the last year the Wolfpack failed to qualify for the state playoffs.



Wednesday's marathon nonconference match began at 4 p.m. and did not finish until 9:45 p.m.


The longest match came in the number two singles battle where Boyte fell to Clinton's Crystal Vause in a three-set match that lasted 3 hours, 15 minutes.
