

**CHECK LIST FOR YOUR NAME**

**Treasurer Wants Lawful Owners To Claim Cash, Other Property**

The North Carolina State Treasurer's office may be holding money, stock or other unclaimed or forgotten property in your name.

Much of the property comes from forgotten bank accounts and insurance proceeds, as well as uncashed checks, unclaimed rent and utility deposits and unused gift certificates, according to State Treasurer Harlan E. Boyles.

For some individuals with Brunswick County addresses, the office is holding for claim sums of cash ranging from \$50 to \$4,153.46 as well as some stock and some property.

They are part of the more than \$10 million in cash and more than \$600,000 in securities which belong to current or former North Carolina residents that Boyles' office recovered during the last fiscal year.

After recovering the property from various sources, his office is now making continuing efforts to locate the rightful owners.

Meanwhile, the money is invested and interest earned gets put to good use. Last year it provided 1,755 low interest education loans to North Carolina students through the North Carolina State Education Assistance Authority.

Individuals who discover that unclaimed property is being held in their name by the State Treasurer's office can write the N.C. Department of State Treasurer, Escheat and Unclaimed Property Section, 325 North Salisbury Street, Raleigh, N.C. 27603-1388, or call 1-919-733-6876.

No time limit applies to inquiries or

**Coastal Resources Commission Eyes Marina Policy**

The N.C. Coastal Resources Commission (CRC) may consider developing a policy on the permitting and location of marinas along the coast.

After years of avoiding the issue, it will be discussed at the state panel's next meeting in December, according to spokesperson Jeanette Johnson.

The CRC met last Thursday and Friday in Wilmington. A subcommittee of the Coastal Resources Advisory Council has made several long-term and short-term recommendations on marinas.

The group suggests the CRC develop a plan for designating appropriate waters as sites for future marinas and making sensitive waters off lim-

its. The CRC also should develop a way of evaluating the cumulative impacts of marinas, get local governments more involved in the permitting and siting of marinas and consider a leasing program of public trust waters.

Among the short-term recommendations, the subcommittee says a change is needed in the definition of marina.

Docks and boat basins built to serve 10 boats or less are not considered marinas, and therefore, don't have to comply with certain regulations.

The subcommittee also recommended that the provision allowing docks and piers to extend one-third of the way into a channel be reviewed

because it creates navigation problems in some areas.

In other matters last week, the CRC postponed consideration of a 6,000-acre site in Pender County that has been nominated as an Area of Environmental Concern.

Ms. Johnson said the commission wants more information before it decides whether a detailed environmental study of the area is warranted.

Owen Jones of Wilmington, who teaches history at Leland Middle School, nominated the area. It includes land that had been under consideration for a hazardous waste incinerator.

The CRC plans to conduct a public hearing on oceanfront setbacks for large structures at its December meeting, Ms. Johnson said.

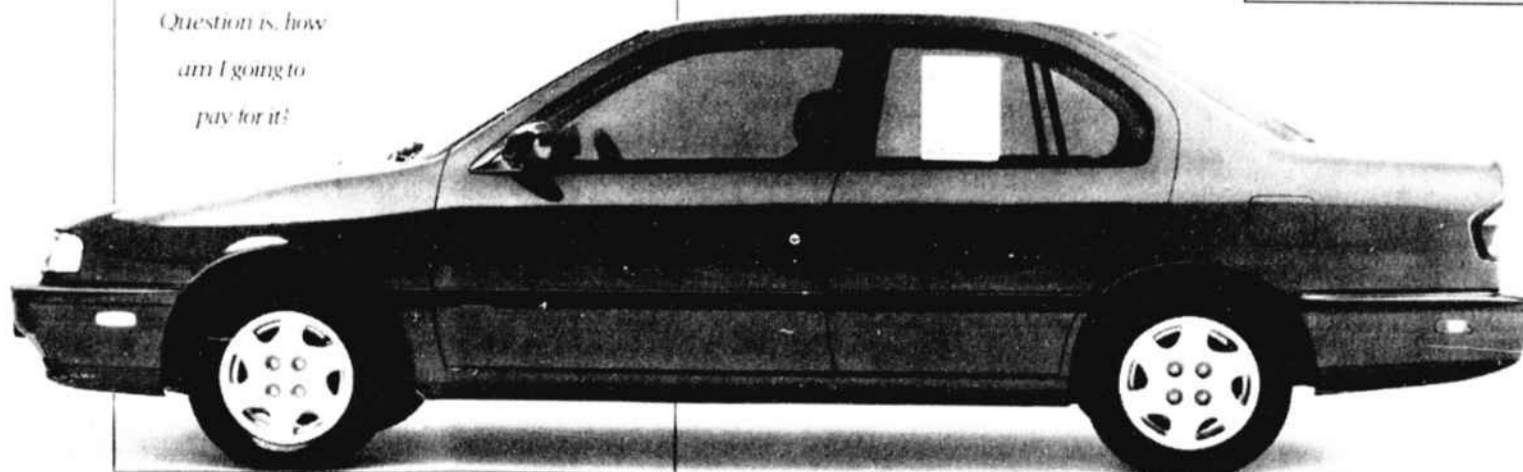
