Sunny skies and a mild temperature drew 57 runners to the N.C. Oyster Festival road races Saturday morning at Holden Beach, one of the best showings in recent years.

Danny West and Debra Caviness, both of Myrtle Beach, S.C., were the top male and female finishers in both the one-mile and the five-kilometer races.

West posted winning times of 5:08 in the mile and 16:41 in the 5K. Ms. Caviness ran the mile in 5:43 and finished the 5K in 19:04.

Top finishers in the 10-kilometer race were John Poisson of Wilmington with a time of 34:50 and Cathy Molnar of Myrtle Beach with a time of 50:00.

Runners-up in the men's one-mile run were Milton Ganyard of Raleigh, C. H. Harts Jr. and Eric Yow, both of Wilmington. Natalie West of Myrtle Beach was second in the female division.

BCC Off And Running With Co-Ed Volleyball

Brunswick Community College has expanded further into intercollegiate athletics this season by fielding the school's first volleyball team.

The 12-member co-ed team is participating in the Eastern Carolina Community College Athletic Conference and competing against league members with established net squads.

However, the BCC team has achieved marked success in its first season boasting a 3-7 overall record as the campaign hits the home stretch.

In its most recent outing, Brunswick swept Edgecombe Community College 15-7, 15-5 while dropping a 15-0, 15-0 decision to Lenoir Community College.

"We believe we have been pretty competitive for a first-year team," said BCC coach Joe Moreland. "The rest of the conference has been fielding volleyball teams for a minimum of two years and some as long as 10 years."

"All the other athletic officials I've talked with in the conference feel like we have done very well for the first year."

Ten league members participate in volleyball including Bladen, Cape Fear, Carteret, Coastal Carolina, Edgecombe, Lenoir, Pitt, Sandhills and Wayne community colleges.

BCC visits Pitt Community College today (Thursday) in a three-team match with Coastal Carolina.

The local squad will play its final home match Monday, Oct. 28, at Shallotte Middle School beginning at 6 p.m. hosting Cape Fear and Wayne Community Colleges.

Leading the team is Catawba College transfer Tracy Moore who is the squad's most outstanding player and captain.

Rounding out the starting lineup are Brad Thomas, John Bean, Catherine Lyles, Suzanne Chutte, Jenecan Norris, Tim Lombardi and Jeremy Vorowski.

Other team members include Heather Willard, Luke Hunt, Robin Walcott and Debra Lanier.

BCC will conclude its season Oct. 30 participating in the conference tournament held at Lenoir Community College in Kinston.

Brunswick hopes to continue to expand more into intercollegiate athletics next year with a tennis that will begin play in the spring or fall according to Moreland.

"Approximately half the conference already participates in tennis and most have golf teams as well."
