# West Pounds North In Homecoming Game

West Brunswick scored a season-high 53 points and unleashed its hard-hitting defense in an impressive shutout against North Brunswick in football Friday night.

The Trojan offense amassed 423 total yards in its Homecoming game, while the defense recovered three fumbles and held North to minus 3 yards and no first downs.

West scored 40 points in the first half and coasted in the second half to keep its undefeated record intact.

The win kept West Brunswick in a tie for first place in the Waccamaw 2-A Conference. The Trojans, now 8-0 overall and 5-0 in league play, travel to East Bladen Friday to battle the conference co-leader.

"I'm real proud of the effort," West Brunswick Coach Marshall Seay said following last week's game. "I thought our kids played real well and executed real well."

Senior Tailback Aldwin Lance rushed for 98 yards—all of it in the second quarter—and scored two touchdowns for the Trojans.

Quarterback Brian Alderson completed three of four passes for 74 yards and two touchdowns. The senior also ran for 33 yards.

West Brunswick jumped out to a 20-0 lead in the first quarter, scoring three touchdowns in a five-minute period.

The Trojans got their first score at the 6:42 mark after cornerback Timmy Daniels recovered a North Brunswick fumble at the Scorpion 22-yard line.

Fullback Ronnie Bradley scored three plays later on a four-yard run to give the Trojans a 6-0 lead. The extra point was blocked.

West Brunswick scored again on its next offensive play as Alderson threw 40 yards to Jimmy Grissett.

Alderson lined up to kick the extra point, but faked the kick and passed to Lonnie Mitchell in the end zone for a two-point conversion and 14-0 lead.

Lance helped set up the third Trojan score with a 23-yard punt return. On the next play from scrimmage, Alderson threw a 32-yard touchdown pass to Matt Boseman.

West defensive tackle Trey Hickman recovered the second North Brunswick fumble two plays later, setting up the fourth Trojan touchdown.

After taking over at the Scorpion 11-yard line, West Brunswick sophomore tailback William Stanley got the score on a seven-yard run.

The touchdown came on the first play of the second quarter, and was the first of three touchdowns in the second quarter.

West Brunswick drove 29 yards in three plays on its next possession. Lance scored from 14 yards out to give the Trojans a 34-0 lead.

On West Brunswick's next possession, Lance got the ball and rumbled 60 yards to the Scorpion 11-yard line and scored on the next play.

West Brunswick added two more touchdowns in the second half, which was played using eight-minute quarters instead of the usual 12 minutes.

Adam Johnson scored on a 20-yard run to cap a three-play, 50-yard drive at the start of the second half.

Timmy Daniels, who entered the

game as back-up quarterback, scored on the next West Brunswick possession on a 44-yard run.

The one-sided game was stopped with about three minutes left following an injury to West Brunswick offensive lineman Pat Polson.

Polson, who separated a shoulder early in the season, reinjured his shoulder Friday night.

"That was a real downer, but we'll get it done," Seay said of the injury. Polson had just returned to the line-up two or three weeks ago.

The only scoring opportunity West Brunswick failed to convert followed the opening kickoff.

The Trojans drove 49 yards in six plays to the Scorpion 15-yard line and narrowly missed a 32-yard field goal.

West Brunswick's highly touted defense was just as effective as the offense Friday night, holding the Scorpions scoreless for the fifth year in a row.

North Brunswick's biggest offensive play was a nine-yard run late in the fourth quarter. The Scorpions played without quarterback Ricky Lowery and running back Seneca Wadell.

The loss dropped North to 1-7 overall and 0-5 in the league. "You've got to admire them to continue to struggle even though they're not tasting any success," said Seay.

# Johnson, Alderson And Branch Named West Gridders Of Week

Linebacker Adam Johnson, quarterback Brian Alderson and special teams member Wayne Branch have been named West Brunswick football players of the week for their performances in last Friday's 53-0 Trojan win over North Brunswick.

Johnson, a 5-foot-11, 220-pound senior, is playing his first year in a Trojan football uniform.

"Adam made many extremely hard hits against North Brunswick and is playing consistently well," said West Brunswick head football coach Marshall Seay. "He is certainly a fine addition to our 'line and' defense. We will also be counting on him Friday to stop East Bladen's 195-pound fullback."

Alderson (6-0, 165, sr.) completed three of four passes against North Brunswick including two for touchdowns.

"Brian ran our offense extremely well last week and called a number of good plays at the line of scrimmage. He has had a high pass completion ratio all season and

has kept his number of interceptions down as well."

"Brian will play big role Friday against East Bladen making the right decisions and not playing into the hands of the Cougar defense."

In addition to his offensive performance, Alderson also started in the Trojan defensive secondary against the Scorpions.

Branch was praised for his performance on all Trojan special teams including those of the kickoff team, punt return, extra-point and kickoff return squads. In addition, the 5-9, 160-pound sophomore, starts at defensive end.

"Wayne has done a tremendous job considering his age and size," said Seay. "He had a great game Friday and is going to also have to have a good game against East Bladen. Since he is our smallest defensive lineman, East Bladen will likely be picking on him. However, Wayne is a very tough youngster and I expect he will be biting East Bladen's big of running backs on the ankles."

# Cougars Rip Fairmont For 4th Straight Win

South Brunswick extended its football winning streak to four games last Friday in a 41-14 whipping of visiting Fairmont in Waccamaw 2-A Conference play.

Sophomore fullback Terry Galloway scored touchdowns on runs of 10 and three yards to spark the Cougars (4-1, 5-3).

Also scoring for South Brunswick were wide receiver Keith Marlowe on a 57-yard run, quarterback Todd Vice on a four-yard run, reserve tailback Corey Brown on a 10-yard run and defen-

sive back Nick Smith on a 38-yard fumble return.

Gary Nowell also kicked five extra points for the Cougars.

Tailback Vinnie Joyner led the South Brunswick rushing attack with 112 yards on 11 carries while Galloway ran for 71 yards on eight carries.

Fairmont remained winless with the loss as the Golden Tornadoes fell to 0-6 in the WC and 0-8 overall.

Both teams continue Waccamaw Conference play Friday with South Brunswick hosting Whiteville and Fairmont visiting West Columbus. Both games begin at 7:30 p.m.
