

# CP&L Breaks Ground For New Center

Carolina Power & Light Co. broke ground for a new \$10 million technical and administrative center at its Brunswick Nuclear Plant near Southport last week. The facility will be located on the south side of the main plant complex.

Lynn W. Eury, executive vice president for power supply groups, touted the center as an example of corporate and community partnership.

While bringing an estimated 150 jobs into the community during construction, he said, the center will also provide about 600 CP&L employees a better work environment.

Having managerial, engineering and administrative offices under one roof, he continued, should result in improved administrative coordination, increased productivity and greater efficiency of operation. The building will replace a fleet of modular office units CP&L has been leasing from the Brunswick County Schools.

Also participating in the program were Russell B. Starkey Jr., vice president, Brunswick Nuclear Project, and R.A. "Al" Watson, senior vice president for nuclear generation.
