Lady Trojans Top Dillon

West Brunswick's girls basketball team opened their season with a 41-38 non-conference win last Tuesday night at Dillon, S.C.

Catherine Bell scored 16 points and pulled down 13 rebounds for the Lady Trojans, who were to play 4-A Dillon again Tuesday night in Shallotte.

"Overall I was pleased with the performance," said West Brunswick Coach Brenda Council. "It's always good to win the first game."

West Brunswick took a 14-6 lead in the first quarter and led 22-15 at halftime. The Lady Trojans increased their lead to 34-24 after three quarters.

Dillon rallied in the fourth quarter, outscoring West Brunswick 14-7, but came up three points short.

Council said the Lady Trojans

were "terrible" from the free throw line last week, converting only three of 14 attempts.

With tougher opponents on the schedule, Council said West Brunswick will have to improve its foul shooting and be more consistent rebounding.

Pam Detrie scored 10 points for the Lady Trojans, and Tikila Morgan added seven.

Danielle Graves led the Dillon attack with 18 points.

West Boys Lose Cage Opener

The West Brunswick boys' basketball team was looking for revenge when it hosted Dillon (S.C.) High School Tuesday night.

Dillon beat the Shallotte team 56-47 last Tuesday in the season-opener for the Trojans.

Shawn Stevenson led West Brunswick with 15 points and 10 rebounds. Patrick Hughes added 13 points, and Jerome Marlowe and Calvin Reaves both scored seven for West.

Dillon took a 13-6 lead in the first quarter and stretched the lead to 28-18 at halftime.

West Brunswick cut the deficit to 45-40 after three quarters but were outscored 11-7 in the final eight minutes.

Trojan Head Basketball Coach Billy Mims said missed opportunities early in the game and poor foul shooting hurt the Trojans.

West Brunswick was 12 of 23 from the free throw line, not counting the front end of one-and-ones that were missed.

West Brunswick, which played last week without several starters who were still involved with football, trailed the entire game.

Mims said the Trojans cut the lead to two points early in the fourth quarter before Dillon went on a 6-0 run.

"I thought the young guys did a good job under the circumstances," Mims said. "We played hard, and it was a much closer ball game than nine points."

Cedric McRoe led Dillon with 16 points. Tim Benjamin, Claude Ladson and Rodderick Singleton each added eight.

Dwain Waddell scored 27 points and Maduka Ballard added 18 as the undefeated North Brunswick boys' basketball team beat Dixon 73-62 last Tuesday night in Leland.

Dixon took a 5-2 lead in the first three minutes of the game and led 7-6 with 4:25 remaining in the opening quarter.

But the Scorpions outscored Dixon 9-6 the rest of the quarter and led 15-13 going into the second period.

Dixon took a 16-15 lead early in the quarter when Thomas Walker nailed a three-pointer and led 22-21 with 3:15 remaining in the half.

North Brunswick took the lead for good with 3:00 to play in the half on a Waddell basket.

The bucket started a 7-0 run for the Scorpions, who led 28-22 with 1:21 to play and 32-28 at the half.

Dixon cut the lead to 32-30 just nine seconds into the third quarter, but the Scorpions outscored the Bulldogs 11-4 over the next three minutes to take a 43-34 lead mid-

way through the third quarter.

North Brunswick led 53-47 going into the final quarter and traded baskets with Dixon in the final eight minutes to win 73-62.

David Miller led a balanced scoring attack for Dixon with 15 points. Walker added 12, Mike Pierce had 11 and Andre Moore chipped in 10 for the 1-A Bulldogs.

Ronnie Ballard scored 10 points for North Brunswick, and Barry Baldwin added eight.
