POTS CAN BE SET Ocean Closed To Shrimping

Ocean waters within three miles of the beach were closed to shrimping Sunday to protect white shrimp spawning populations.

In an unrelated action, the state opened area internal coastal waters to fishing pots effective Monday.

The N.C. Division of Marine Fisheries announced both regulatory actions through proclamations issued last week.

The temporary ban on shrimping affects waters up to three miles offshore between Cape Fear and the South Carolina state line.

Pots for the harvest of crab, cel, fish and shrimp can be used in inshore waters. They cannot be placed in marked navigation channels, in the middle third of other channels or in any other location where they may constitute a hazard to navigation.
