West Pins Aynor In Wrestling Finale

West Brunswick's wrestling team ended its season last Wednesday with a win over Aynor (S.C.) after being eliminated from the state playoffs the night before.

The Trojans, county champs in only their second year with a high school wrestling program, beat visiting Aynor 41-25 to finish the season at 10-12 in dual meets.

West Brunswick beat South Granville 54-22 before losing to Dixon 63-12 in the opening round of the 1-A/2-A playoffs last Tuesday in Dixon, said Coach Joe Noble.

After a slow start, the Trojans won 10 of their last 14 matches. Noble said the extended football season had an effect on the wrestling team.

"We started out in the hole," he said. "I'm real pleased with the way we finished because we have mostly second-year wrestlers."

West Brunswick will lose only two wrestlers to graduation this year, so Noble expects another solid team next season.

Wrestlers from West, North and South Brunswick high schools will

compete in the East Regionals Friday and Saturday in Williamston.

The top four wrestlers from each weight class will advance to the state finals Feb. 27-29 in Greensboro.

"I think we have a real good shot in five or six places," Noble said. "There's a possibility as many as seven or eight going if they wrestle the way they can."
