

Calvary, Friendship Leading Area Church Softball League

Calvary Baptist and Friendship Baptist are atop their divisions in the Brunswick County Church Softball League after two weeks of play.

Calvary leads the north division with a 2-0 mark, while Friendship leads the south with an identical record.

Friendship opened the season with a 21-4 win over Camp Methodist and posted an 8-2 win over Emanuel Outreach last Friday.

Calvary Baptist routed Seaside Methodist 35-3 in its opening game and beat Zion Baptist 22-17 on Friday.

Three teams—Jennies Branch, Ocean View and New Britton—are tied for second place in the south division with records of 1-0.

Jennies Branch beat Letties Grove 33-4 in its only game. Ocean View was a 17-12 winner over Mount Olive, while New Britton edged Shallotte First Baptist 11-10 in its season opener.

In other games, Supply Baptist beat Soldier Bay 16-9 in their opener but lost to Mount Olive 17-7 on Monday.

Letties Grove beat Seaside Methodist 23-22 Monday after losing to Camp Methodist 16-13 last Friday.

The church softball league started March 30 at Waccamaw District Park and play continues through mid-July.

Each team will play the six other teams in its division twice and each team outside the division once during the regular season.

Young Guns Edge Turntables

Chris Johnson scored a game-high 36 points as the Young Guns beat the Turntables 68-60 in the Brunswick County Parks and Recreation Men's Basketball League tournament championship last Thursday.

The Young Guns, runners-up to the Turntables during the regular season, had defeated the Lakers and Sonics to advance to the finals.

The Turntables, league champs for at least the last five years, got 26 points from Trampus Gause but came up short in last week's final at Shallotte Middle School.

In the consolation game, William Johnson scored 23 points as the Lakers nipped the Warriors 83-82 to capture third-place honors. Roger Vaught scored 21 points for the Warriors.

In second-round tournament action last Wednesday, Chris Johnson scored 36 points to lead the Young Guns to a 94-90 win over the Lakers, who were led by Charles

Webb with 29 points.

Trampus Gause poured in 37 points to lead the Turntables to a 79-74 win over the Warriors in the other second-round game. Randy Daniels scored 20 for the Warriors.

The Young Guns opened the tournament two weeks ago with an 84-79 win over the Sonics. Charles Hill led the Guns with 26 points, and Kevin Grant scored 28 for the Sonics.

Trampus Gause scored 34 points to lead the Turntables to an easy 101-79 victory over the Brew Crew in their opening game.

In other first-round tournament action, Robert Thompson scored 18 points as the Warriors beat the Rockets 69-64. Marvin Jones led the Rockets with 24 points.

The Lakers also got past their first-round opponent in convincing fashion, posting a 102-80 win over Igloo Freeze. William Johnson led the Lakers with 30 points, and Jeff Register had 22 for the Freeze.

South Brunswick's tennis team posted a pair of Waccamaw 2-A Conference shutout wins in the past week to improve its record to 2-1.

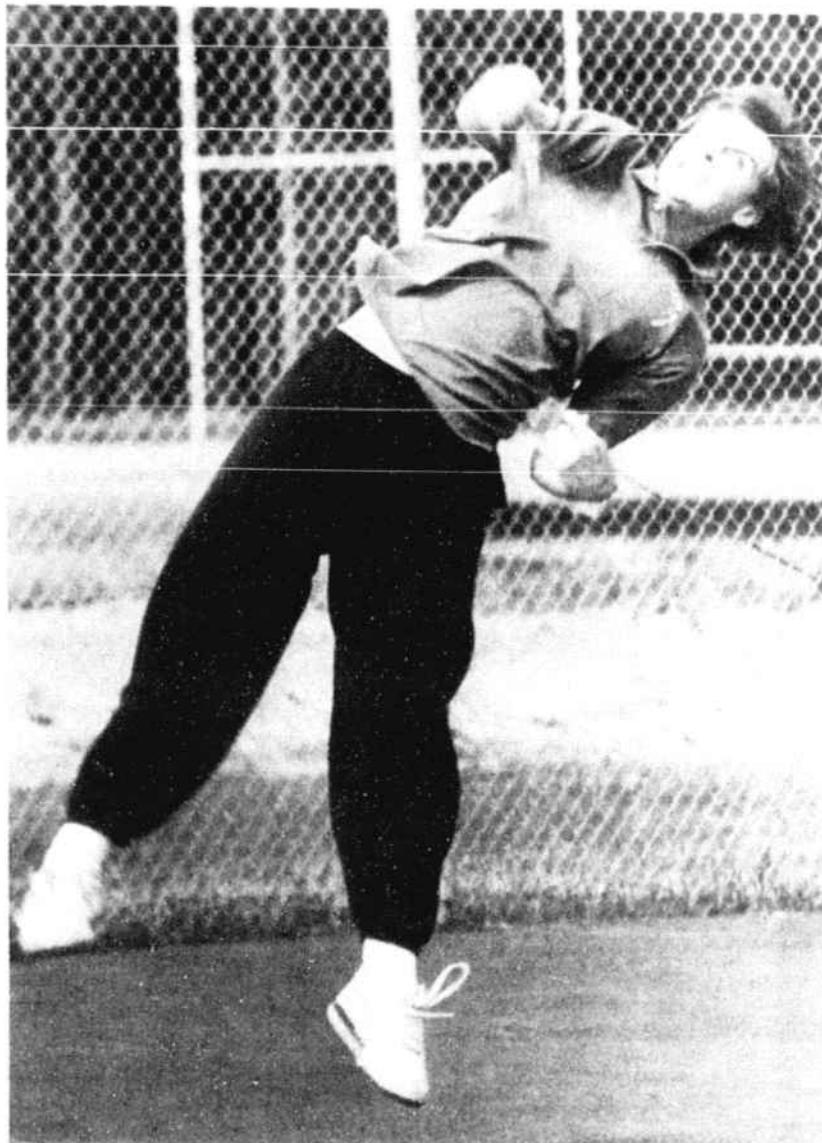

West Trojan Tennis Team Beats Vikings, Mustangs

The West Brunswick boys' tennis team lost its second match of the season Monday, but won the only two matches that really counted last week.

The Trojans fell to non-conference opponent St. Pauls 7-1 Monday, but defeated West Columbus and South Robeson in Waccamaw 2-A Conference action last week.

West Brunswick shut out the visiting South Robeson Mustangs 9-0 last Thursday in a match that was rained out March 30.

The Trojans (2-1, 2-2) picked up their first win of the young season last Wednesday, beating host West Columbus 6-2.

Benji Mankin, the Trojans' only winner against St. Pauls Monday, remains undefeated for the season.

"St. Pauls is the best team we'll play all year. They are very well balanced," West Brunswick Coach Marti Gillis said. "The team continues to improve as we gain match experience."

The Trojans, who are second in the conference behind unbeaten Whiteville, were scheduled to resume conference play Wednesday with a match at East Bladen. West hosts South Brunswick next Monday.
