South Brunswick Cougars Pull Off Dramatic Track Win

The South Brunswick boys' track team won the final event to pull off a dramatic victory over Worthington Christian Academy of Ohio last Wednesday in Boiling Spring Lakes.

South's Eric Chandler came from behind on the final leg of the 1600meter relay to give the Cougars a one-point win over the visitors, 65-64. West Brunswick finished third with 52 points.

Worthington Christian won the girls' meet, dominating the long-distance running events and racking up

77 points. South finished second with 50 and West Brunswick had 44. In the boys' meet, South Brunswick posted victories in the 100 me-

ter run and five other events. Besides running anchor in the 1600-meter relay. Chandler picked up wins in the 110-meter high hurdles and the 300-meter intermediate hurdles.

The Cougars also edged West Brunswick by less than a second in 800-meter relay. Keith Burke won the pole vault, clearing 10 feet, 6 inches, as South took all three places

West Brunswick's boys' team got a strong performance from Jerry Reaves, who won the high jump with a leap of 5 feet, 10 inches, and the triple jump with a mark of 40 feet, 3 inches.

The Trojans also picked up a win in the long jump as Reggie Frink edged two South Brunswick jumpers with a leap of 18 feet, 11 inches.

West Brunswick's boys won the the 400-meter relay and took the top three places in the shot put. Bobby Lovette led the way with a toss of 39 feet, 2 1/2 inches.

In the girls' meet, West Brunswick's Irene Johnson won the 200meter run and the triple jump with a mark of 33 feet, 9 1/2 inches.

Jennifer Vereen won the long jump for the Lady Trojans with a leap of 12 feet, 4 3/4 inches. West also won the 800-meter relay.

South Brunswick's girls picked up wins in the 100-meter dash, 400meter relay, discus and shot put.

Both county schools were to compete in their first Waccamaw 2-A Conference meet of the season Tuesday.

South was to host West Columbus and Fairmont, while the Trojans were to travel to Whiteville to face the Wolfpack, North Brunswick and East Bladen.


