TAKE A SCENIC RIDE! There's Nothing Like A Ferry

Thether you're tired of being behind the wheel, relish time spent on the water, or simply want to feed the gulls, there's nothing that satisfies like a ride on the Southport-Fort Fisher Ferry across the Cape Fear River.

While riding a ferry may not be the fastest way to get from shore to shore, sometimes it's the trip itself that counts.

Typically, passengers who board the comfortable Sandy Graham or a sister ferry at Price's Creek near Southport are in no hurry to get to the other side. They're out for a bit of fun, not commuting to work.

Passengers can choose the enclosed passenger lounge or the deck, for a scenic view of the river during the 30-minute ride that ends so quickly you may want to make the return trip by ferry as well and double your fun.

Knowledgeable ferryboat riders bring along a treat for the hordes of seagulls that gather over the churning waters at the stern of the vessel. It's a treat for children and adults to watch the birds compete for bits of bread or popcorn.

The pleasurable trip carries passengers along a lovely stretch of riverfront, with views of Orton Plantation, Brunswick Town State Historic Site, ADM Chemicals and the Price's Creek Light, a former navigational range light.

Of course, there are also boats of all sizes and glimpses of the small dredge spoil islands that serve as rookeries for colonial seabirds.

Southport, a picturesque waterfront community celebrating its 200th anniversary this year with numerous special events, offers galleries, parks and the CP&L Visitors Center. Brunswick Town State Historic Site and Orton Plantation are a quick trip from Southport on N.C. 133.

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Across the river, prime destinations are the state historic site at Fort Fisher, which played a key role guarding the Cape Fear River in the Civil War, and the North Carolina Aquarium, one of three located along the state's coast.

The Southport-Fort Fisher Ferry accommodates cars, bicyclists and pedestrians. One-way fare is \$3 for a car or other vehicle 20 feet in length or less; \$6, vehicle or combination of vehicles from 20 feet up to and including 32 feet in length; \$1, bicycles; and 50 cents, pedestrian.

While subject to change, said John Shelton, a clerk at the Southport ferry terminal, the ferry usually operates on its winter schedule from Nov. 1 to April 30, when it adds more crossings. To double-check on the schedule or to find out about accommodations/fees for larger vehicles, call the ferry office, (919) 457-6942.
