

Larceny Defendants Ordered To Pay Restitution To Victims

Two defendants were ordered to pay restitution in Brunswick County District Court last week to victims who had items stolen from them.

Judges D. Jack Hooks Jr. and Napoleon B. "Poli" Barefoot Jr. heard eight cases involving breaking and entering with larceny, larceny of firearms and shoplifting charges.

One defendant was sentenced to 14 days in jail and ordered to pay the victim \$1,200 for items stolen. Another received a suspended sentence and was ordered to pay \$480 in restitution for a stolen firearm.

Those were among the following cases heard during a short two-day District Court session May 4-5:

Willie L. Daise, breaking and/or entering, Brunswick County Jail 29 days, suspended sentence two years, not go on or about any premises owned or occupied by plaintiff, costs remitted.

Thomas Fox, misdemeanor possession of stolen goods, N. C. Department of Corrections two years, suspended sentence two years, supervised probation two years, not go on or about any premises owned or occupied by plaintiff, \$1,200 restitution to plaintiff, Brunswick County Jail 14 days, work release hours to be determined by probation officer, \$150 attorney fees, \$200 and costs; larceny pursuant breaking and entering, voluntarily dismissed.

Ronald Keith Granger, misdemeanor larceny, N.C. Department of Corrections two years, suspended sentence two years, supervised probation two years, restitution \$480, \$100 and costs, assessment for substance abuse, \$150 attorney fees, submit to warrantless searches, submit to test, not use, possess or consume any controlled substance for two years; misdemeanor larceny, N.C. Department of Corrections two years to run at expiration of previous sentence, suspended sentence two years supervised probation two years.

Three Men Charged After Shooting Reported

Three men were charged Saturday after shots were fired outside a Leland convenience store, narrowly missing a man.

The shooting occurred around 12:40 p.m. in the parking lot of the H.B. Lee Buy-Rite on Village Road. The suspects allegedly assaulted someone leaving the store and fired shots that struck the building, Brunswick County Sheriff's Deputy Brian Sanders reported.

Anthony Canty, 21, of Navassa was charged with assault with a deadly weapon with intent to kill. He was being held in the Brunswick County Jail under \$3,000 bond Monday.

Also charged were Derrick Andrews, 18, and Leon Bowman, 23, both of Navassa. Andrews was being held under \$2,000 bond on charges of simple assault and accessory after the fact to a felony. Bowman was charged with accessory after the fact to a felony and had his bond set at \$1,000.

According to Sanders' report, the victim was pushed down in the parking lot and beaten about the face but managed to stand and hit one suspect.

Another suspect allegedly pulled a handgun from a Chevrolet truck and fired two shots at the victim, missing him but hitting the building, Sanders reported.

The victim then ran behind the building where another shot was fired, Sanders stated. The suspects fled the scene in the truck.

Sheriff's Detective Nancy Simpson reported no one was injured in the incident, which apparently stemmed from an argument the men had earlier in the week.

In other reports on file at the sheriff's department:

Two homes on Swain Street at Sunset Harbor were broken into, reported Deputy Patti Hewett. At one, a front door was pried open where a television, two utility carts and three rods and reels were stolen. Damage was \$200. Someone broke a rear

window to another home and took a blender and liquor worth \$180. Damage was listed at \$300.

Approximately \$2,925 in jewelry was reported stolen from a Shallotte Point apartment last Thursday, May 7, reported Deputy R.W. Long II. The suspects entered through an unlocked door between 7 p.m. and 11 p.m.

Three checks worth \$165 were forged at the Simmons Calabash Beverage Mart, reported R.W. Long II. The owner did not give the person permission to sign and cash the checks.

A boat motor and gas tank worth \$835 were stolen from a home on Sunset Harbor Road between Easter weekend and May 9, reported Deputy Cathy Hamilton. Someone broke into a mobile home and left a radio playing, but did not take anything inside.

A window air conditioner was stolen from a home in Water Wonderland near Seaside between April 18 and May 4, reported Deputy Keithan Home. The thieves caused \$200 in damage while taking the \$300 unit.

Locks were cut on two utility sheds on Sparrow Lane at Shell Point between May 3 and May 10, reported Deputy Richard Long. Taken were three rods and reels, fishing gear and a weed eater, all worth \$530. Damage was \$20 to the summer home owned by a Durham resident.

Damage was listed at \$300 to the Carolina Power and Light Company Training Facility building on N.C. 133 and N.C. 87 Saturday, reported Ms. Hamilton. Someone broke the glass doors on the front of the build-

ing between 4 p.m. and 9 p.m. Nothing was discovered missing.

Damage was listed at \$950 to a parked van and signs at the Oak Island Bridge at Long Beach, Ms. Hamilton reported. Someone used a shotgun to shoot the van and signs owned by Walt's Beach Club at Long Beach. The rear and side windows were shot, causing damage inside the van and to the sign panels.

A 1989 Plymouth was reported stolen from a home in Tripp's Mobile Home Park at Shallotte Point last week, reported Long II. The owner had lost a set of car keys, and a second set was stolen from the car while it was locked.

Vandals forced open several roll-out windows, causing \$600 in damage to a home in Oak Haven along Seashore Road, reported Deputy James Ingram. The owners, from Pinehurst, said the damage occurred between Nov. 30 and May 9.

Damage was listed at \$600 to a bed and clothing and \$500 to a mobile home that caught fire Sunday near Carolina Shores, reported R.W. Long II. The owner returned to the residence to find the middle bedroom on fire. Calabash VFD Chief Jerry Prince advised that he saw no evidence of foul play, Long reported.
