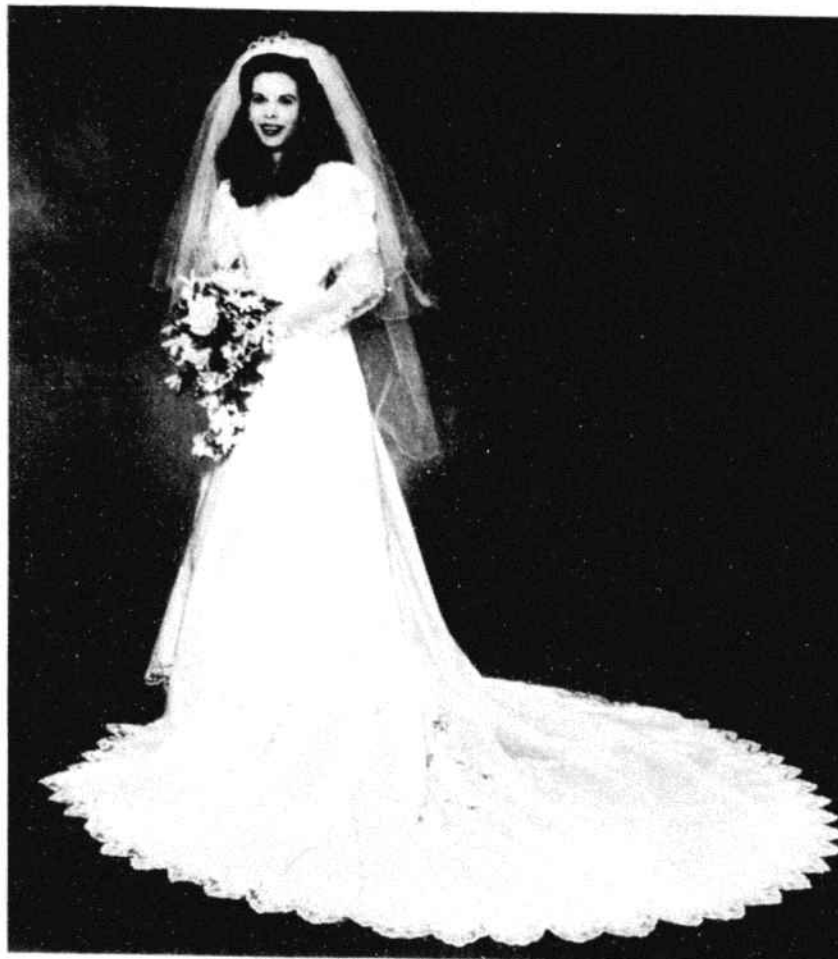
Larry McKenzie of Orlando, Fla., cousin of the bride, was ring bearer.
