Awards Day Recognizes Senior Achievements

West Brunswick High School honored its seniors during a two-hour awards day program Thursday morning.

Leading the list of those recognized were the class's valedictorian and salutatorian, Terrence (Terry) Nawara of Calabash and Pamela Detrie of Shallotte.

Nawara, a National Merit Scholarship Finalist, has accepted an appointment to the U.S. Naval Academy at Annapolis, Md. He was the only student in Brunswick County to qualify for a Presidential Award for Excellence in Math this year.

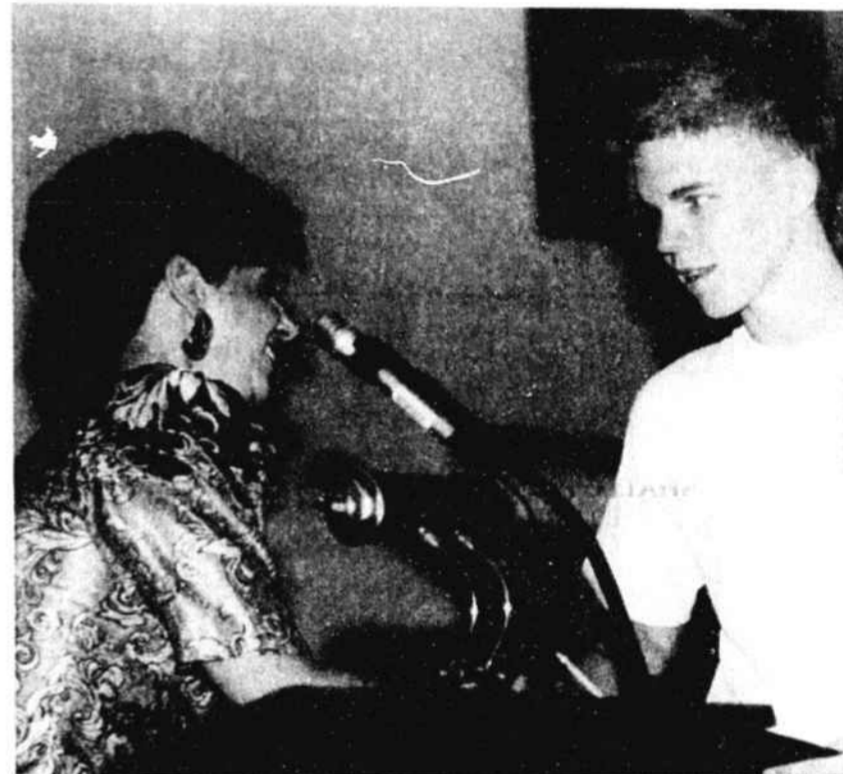
